The longest-running "Nutcracker" in the Lehigh Valley returns for its 54th year as Pennsylvania Youth Ballet/Ballet Guild of the Lehigh Valley fills the Zoellner Arts Center stage featuring more than 100 artists — including guest performers from the Pennsylvania Ballet, Philadelphia; alumni of Pennsylvania Youth Ballet/Ballet Guild of the Lehigh Valley and local high school talent.

All performances will feature a 48-piece orchestra, the Southside Sinfonietta, under the direction of Eugene Albulescu of Lehigh University. Over 80 Lehigh Valley area students will sing Waltz of the Snowflakes and holiday music in the Zoellner lobby before each show.
